We will gather in the courtyard with refreshments and music, and then all go in to the Sanctuary together so that we all see it for the first time at the same time! The Children's Church group is canceling their usual service, so they can be part of this grand rededication service. There will be our regular potluck afterwards, so just come and be a part of this.
