GENERAL CONFERENCE REPORT: We are only one day into the General Conference Session in Atlanta, but, as is traditional, the Nominating Committee has already nominated a new General Conference President, and he has been approved by the delegates. It is Elder Ted N. C. Wilson. He is 62, and is currently a Vice-President of the General Conference. While I know virtually nothing of the deliberations, there was a rumor that the current president, Elder Jan Paulsen, had indicated that, even though he is 75, he is in good health and was willing to continue. Evidently the Committee chose to go in this direction. I'm sure more will come out over time.

Elder Wilson comes from a long line of church leaders, as you will see below. His father was the president of our North American Division for about 12 years, I think, and then General Conference president for another 12. He is still alive, about 90 years old, and has been very active until fairly recently. Elder Wilson's grandfather was also a major church leader.

The following is a brief paragraph from *Adventist Today* about Elder Wilson. Pray for him! Elder Wilson is "a vice president and son of former GC president Neal Wilson. He received nearly as many votes in the nominating committee at the 2005 session as did Paulsen. At age 62 he is a decade younger than Paulsen, but many fear that he would be a throwback as president with a more intrusive style of leadership and possibly championing ultra-conservative causes. Wilson has deep roots in the traditional Adventist leadership system. His grandfather, N. C. Wilson, was a missionary in Africa and later in Indonesia, division president in Southern Asia and later in the South Pacific, a union president in the U.S. and GC vice president for North America. His father was later to hold the same North American leadership position before becoming GC president. Ted Wilson directed Metro Ministries in New York City and then went as a missionary to Africa. He spent the 1980s at the General Conference as an associate secretary, went to Russia as division president from 1992 to 1996 and then was elected president of the Review & Herald Publishing Association where he served until 2000 when he was elected a GC vice president. He has an earned PhD from New York University."
