It was a very special gift, to get to go to Hawaii to speak for their campmeeting/convocation—but I would rather have been here! All weekend I kept thinking—Now they're in church. Now Iki's speaking. Now they're going to the Memorial service! I just hated to miss it all. I preached to about 500 Friday night, in the Honolulu Central Church. Then Sabbath morning the church was filled, all the parking was taken, and over 1000 from all over the island were there—just an amazing time. They had Samoan youth, Samoan men's chorus (fantastic, went to the General Conference), Filipino, Korean, the Academy, an incredible trumpet player—just a great treat, to sit on the front row and just soak it in. I came back with a dream to talk my fellow Orange County pastors into having an Orange County campmeeting for one day, at the Crystal Cathedral, with every single church closing and coming together for an awesome festival like that!

I had a few hours free on Sunday and Monday around some dinner appointments, so someone invited me to go sailing, ended up 6 miles out on the ocean, and then in the middle of a pod of dolphins! Then one round of not very skilled golf but gorgeous scenery with the Conference president, a friend for 40 years, Ralph Watts III, and then flew all night home.

Now for this weekend here: In the OT they would build altars whenever they wanted to mark an era, a place, where God had done something special, where they had met God in a special way. And so tomorrow, October 2, we are building sort of an altar, celebrating one year since we were given the honor of coming to GGSDA.
