MERCY HOUSE: Noemi and Albert Decena took me to Mercy House this week, to learn how we can be part of their ministry to the homeless in Orange County. What a great, great place this is, just a terrific ministry that covers everything from the time someone becomes homeless, until they are back into a home with some sort of employment. During the winter they have two facilities where people can sleep at night, and churches volunteer to help from 5-8 pm. Here is Noemi's note: "The Cold Weather Emergency Shelter program provides up to 200 beds per night for the homeless in Orange County at the National Guard Armory in Santa Ana, CA. The homeless receive a nutritious meal, a warm shower, a safe place to sleep, and access to valuable social services. Volunteers are needed to help with setting up tables and chairs, cleaning and putting out the sleeping mats, assisting with client registration, setting out snacks, passing out donations, serving dinner and cleaning up. Hours: 5-8 pm, Tuesday and Wednesday nights starting January. Ages: 10yrs and above. Sign-up sheets are available at the foyer. Contact info: Noemi Decena (714) 875-4389."
