I have been called to race to the hospital to visit somebody who is possibly dying, so let me send out a very tight and short Pastor's Newsletter!

THE WAY--Pastor Garrett is a bit sick this week, and so THE WAY has been canceled for tonight. Please spread the word!

SANCTUARY--9:30. We will rock your soul with our contemporary worship service, and then hopefully get you thinking with my message on our series, "THE WAITING ROOM." Virtually everybody in the Bible had a period of time where they knew that God had called them to do something great--but they had to wait. Weeks, months, 3 years in the desert, 40 years in the wilderness. Even Jesus waited 18 years in the carpenter shop before exploding into the consciousness of the world, and yet in 3 years He changed the world forever.

How do you know when to "be still and wait on the Lord," and when smash through the barriers and obstacles and get it done, force the issue, make it happen, and claim what you believe is God's destiny for you?
