"Dad and I have been thinking about the true meaning of giving and receiving. Rather than see how many presents we get and how much goodies we can eat. We are taking a trip" explained mom. "Oh cool, are we going skiing for the holidays?" asked Joy. We arrived to the main village. The people gave us a big welcome dinner. We spent those days working alongside the missionary families, studying the bible with the Mixtec people and exchanging stories. The children gave us toys they had made and knitted. We came together on Sabbath for worship. We spent a great time sharing with one another about the love of Jesus. As our trip came to an end, Joy and I felt sad to leave our new friends. "Dad, mom, we felt like part of their family. Zach and I will miss them" said Joy. "This trip was a true blessing to all of us. We experienced a glimpse of what Heaven will be like—one joyful family together with Jesus" said mom with a smile.

As we traveled back home I began to understand our journey. During the hike the longer I carried the backpack the heavier it got. This made me think about our sinfulness. * Butterflies are insects.
