Mother gathered her children. "I have news for you," she said. "We are going on a difficult and dangerous journey to join Father." Niang's father had left Myanmar to work in another country. But he didn't have the proper papers and he was arrested. Father soon realized that God had a plan for him even though he didn't understand it. The officials reviewing Father's case realized that Father was a member of a tribe that was in great danger in his homeland. "If your family can join you here," an official told him, "we can help you live in peace." Father sent word to Mother to try to join him.

Back home the family prayed for God's protection on their dangerous journey. Mother and the family gathered a few belongings and started to make their journey to reach father. Mother led the way down the dusty path. "If the government's agents find us, they will surely arrest us," Mother whispered. "So walk very quietly." Niang and her family walked for many hours each day on dusty paths. The travel was hard and tiring. They stayed in people's homes that fed them and kept them safe. Mother often said "Let's thank God for protecting us. With every step we take we get closer to freeeddom!"

The family came to the river that marked the border between their homeland and freedom. Mother prayed for God's guidance and help. Mother found a man with a small boat who was willing to ferry them across the river. Mother knew Jesus had placed this man in their path to help them. Niang trembled as she climbed into the boat. "When I am afraid, I will put my trust in you" Niang whispered as she gripped the sides of the boat as it bounced against the current.

At last the boat bumped against the far shore, and the children clamored out. Niang whispered a prayer of thanks to Jesus as she felt the solid ground under her feet again. The ride in the river was a bumpy and scary



one but she knew Jesus would protect them. The family didn't dare hesitate on the riverbank, but hurried into the jungle, away from any soldiers' guns. 

The customs may be different, even the languages may be different and often those around you don't understand how hard it is to adapt to new surroundings or learn all they need to know to live in a new place. Niang and her family are Adventist Christians, but many fellow refugees were not. They were able to teach others that Jesus loves them, that He died for them, and that He wants to be their friend forever. They were able to illustrate this by telling them of the hard journey they had. Niang was reminded of the journey the Israelites took when Moses led them out of Egypt. The Israelites had to adjust to a new living and traveling in the wilderness but with God leading the way they were safe and protected. God had a plan for them and He has a plan for each of us.



Neptune •

- It is nearly 4 times the size of Earth.
- It is covered in thin wispy white clouds that stretch out around the planet.
- Storms have been spotted swirling around its surface and freezing winds that blow about ten times faster than hurricanes on Earth making it the windiest planet.
- It is a large, water planet with a blue hydrogen -methane atmosphere and faint rings.





Giraffe

- A giraffe's habitat is usually found in African savannas, grasslands or open woodlands.
- The hair that makes up a giraffe's tail is about 10 times thicker than the average strand of human hair.
- Giraffe's neck is 1.5 to 1.8 meters long, it contains the same number of vertebrae as a human neck.



- Giraffes are ruminants. This means that they have more than one stomach. In fact, giraffes have four stomachs.
- Drinking is one of the most dangerous times for a giraffe. While it is getting a drink it cannot keep a look out for predators and is vulnerable to attack.
- Male giraffes sometimes fight with their necks over female giraffes.
 This is called "necking". The two giraffes stand side by side and one giraffe swings his head and neck, hitting his head against the other giraffe. Sometimes one giraffe is hit to the ground during a combat.
- Giraffes have bluish-purple tongues which are tough and covered in bristly hair to help them with eating the thorny Acacia trees.

ORIGINAL MEANING

In the original language of the New Testament, Koine Greek, the word to FORGIVE is ἀφίημι (afiemi) which means to <u>send away</u>. When God forgives us He sends our sins away.

Character Focus:

Acknowledge when and how you have difficulty forgiving others.

Thank God for ways you have seen forgiveness offered readily in your family.

Personal Requests:

Ask God to help you, your siblings, and parents, to be willing to forgive others quickly, in all situations. Ephesians 4:2-3 - Ephesians 4:32 - Colossians 3:12-14

Dear Jesus, thank you for dying on the cross so that we can have our sins forgiven. Please give me Your love in my heart so I can forgive as You have forgiven me. Amen
