CAN YOU IMAGINE what that first Sabbath after the Resurrection must have been like? The atmosphere in the Upper Room or out by the lake must have been electric--the Person in the middle of their group had been dead last week--now He's standing right there. 500 people knew Jesus was alive--because they had seen Him themselves. First time they had ever heard of that. The veil in the Temple had been ripped--from top to bottom. Some people who had been dead for centuries were walking around alive. And for 40 days they had Jesus to themselves--no crowds, no miracles, nothing--just being with Jesus--like the 1000 years WE will have with Him someday!

May you feel something of that same electricity as we eat and drink the symbols of that weekend. And, as Ephesians 1 says, may the same Resurrection Power that raised HIM from the dead, lift YOU from whatever is trying to kill you this week and make you feel more alive than you have ever felt before!
