Pathfinders Show Off Their Drill Moves at Lake Skinner Camporee

The Garden Grove Pathfinders shone at the Lake Skinner Camporee April 28-30, 2006. At this annual event our club taught two honors—Edible Plants and Animal Tracking—and participated in a drill down.

The Edible Plants honor was taught by several teens, including Charlene Gibbs, Katherine Hogan, Mitchell Phillips, and Mirela Voelker. They taught Pathfinders how to identify plants in the wild that can be eaten and about a deadly mushroom called the Amenities. They shared the cardinal edibility rule with the group, which is "If you don't know what it is, don't eat it." A group of 8 Pathfinders from several clubs earned this important wilderness survival honor.

The Animal Tracking honor was led by John Krell with some help from the Master Guide candidates, Alex Caldwell, Amanda Sanchez, Justin Setiawan, and William Voelker. The Pathfinders learned to identify different types of animals in the area based on the paw prints. Plaster casts were made of various paw prints, including rabbits, dogs, a tire track, and what appeared to be a bobcat.

A major highlights was "The Drill Down Competition". Mr. Mountain, an expert drill sergeant, called out the drills. 50 Pathfinders from the Orange County clubs participated. Justin Setiawan, Kevin Stanish, Mitchell Phillips, Katherine Hogan, Kimberly Hogan, and our newest Pathfinder, Courtney Leon, marched for Garden Grove. They were led through some simple drills, such as "left face," "right face," and "about face," and then through some more complex drills One by one and at times in groups of 3 or 4,

Pathfinders were eliminated. The group quickly shrunk to about 30, then 20, and finally only 6 Pathfinders remained. Garden Grove Pathfinders were so proud as we watched our own Katherine Hogan, Kevin Stanish, and Justin Setiawan hang on until the very end. Justin Setiawan took second place, and Kevin Stanish took third place! What an accomplishment by our very own Garden Grove Pathfinders! Our Pathfinder club and the Garden Grove Adventist Church have been blessed with some very talented young people! We are justifiably proud of all 7 Garden Grove Pathfinders that took part in this tough competition.

BOSNIA MISSION PROJECT - 2006

Bob Maukovich has received a request from ADRA Serbia and Montenegro asking if he would give assistance in their efforts to help the people who have been devastated from the tremendous flooding in the Eastern European Bloc. As a result, Bob has made a request to the church for donations of warm clothing and shoes for adults and children, as well as suitcases and to raise \$4,000 during May and June. The funds received will go toward defraying the costs for shipping, border fees and other expenses involved in the project. If adequate funds are received, Bob plans to purchase a used minivan while in Bosnia to donate to the orphanage he has been helping in Serbia. The deadline for donations of clothing, shoes and suitcases is June 24. These items can be donated through Community Services and marked "Bosnia Mission" or given directly to Bob. Monetary gifts must be into the church treasury no later than July 22. The Church Board has approved this fundraising project and we encorage you to keep this project in your prayers and in your giving.
